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The school of Economics and Administrative Sciences is composed of six undergraduate academic programs: International Business Administration, Finance Administration and Public Accounting – these three programs with High Quality Accreditation – Business Administration, Economy, and Marketing. Additionally, as part of the School, there is the Entrepreneurship Unit, which is in charge of strengthening the entrepreneurial spirit, and the Business Development and Training Center, from where the relationship with external public and business actors is managed.

The activities of the School focus on the missionary functions of the university and the development of competences such as entrepreneurship, which are understood as the ability to propose the creation of new companies, or modify existing ones through innovative processes that create added value. The strategic management of companies, understood as the ability to optimize and efficiently use resources, establishes negotiation techniques and processes under the criteria of strategy in order to achieve the objectives proposed by the senior management and leadership in the process of regional development where they can propose, direct and execute projects and actions that contribute to the solution of the socioeconomic problems of the region.

The program of Economics was first developed in 1994, in response to the need to train economists who favor regional development, and who are aware of the thrust that the Economics program would give to the Faculty of Economic and Administrative Sciences.

The graduate from the program is characterized by being an integral professional, with high disciplinary training, supported with quantitative tools and clear administrative and financial principles. The graduate is a leader and manager in development processes who is convinced that all knowledge must be based on permanent innovation and updating.

The program of economics has fundamental training areas, such as economic theory, the history and epistemology area, the quantitative area with emphasis on statistics and econometrics, the management and project areas, among others.

The program of economics, since its development, has continued to research processes until today, since there are three research seeds within the program, as well as internationalization processes are being strengthened. Furthermore, the program permanently develops visualization strategies, which should result in better possibility of sustainability.
